It gives me great pleasure to welcome you to this concert, celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Our programme includes a wide variety of music, celebrating each of the decades of her service, and we are sure you will enjoy the journey.



Looking back it seems incredible that our last performance was the Christmas concert here in December 2019, before the outbreak of the Covid-19 coronavirus pandemic. Through lockdown we ventured into the world of virtual rehearsals on Zoom, playing along to Spotify and YouTube recordings by bands from around the world. Sadly, in early 2020, two founding members of the band, Jean Jessop and Michael Gerard, passed away. Both were devoted supporters of the band and always remained positive despite long-term health issues. They are certainly missed by us all.

Weekly in-person rehearsals then resumed in the middle of July 2021 and we were fortunate that the size of The Big Shed enabled us to have social distancing, together with other Covid precautions, in place. Since our return we have



also been delighted to welcome a number of new players, reflecting the friendly and welcoming nature of the band. We were then all set for our Christmas concert in December 2021, to be performed to an in-person and on-line audience, before unfortunately we had to cancel the event due to the prevalence of the Omicron variant. It's certainly great to finally be back!

BRIAN HUMPHERSON MBE ~ MUSICAL DIRECTOR



After qualifying as a music teacher in 1967, Brian held posts in Nottingham and Leicestershire schools. For many years he worked as a conductor for the Leicestershire School of Music and often acted as musical director for local choirs and operatic societies, notably Broom Leys Choral Society which he directed for 29 years.

As Director of Music and Performing Arts at Guthlaxton College, Brian led the Guthlaxton Concert Band and Big Band to national and international success. The college also became renowned for its strong tradition in musical theatre. After leaving the classroom he continued to work as a music examiner, teacher trainer and arts moderator until his retirement in 2016.

A keen pianist, Brian has held a lifelong interest in jazz and popular music. He still performs regularly with various ensembles, including the Nottingham Jazz Orchestra. He was awarded an MBE for services to music education in Leicestershire.

We are privileged to have Alan Holford as our conductor when Brian is unable to attend a rehearsal.

The band performs a varied repertoire which includes well known marches, music from shows, arrangements of classical pieces, popular tunes and works from the British Wind Band tradition. There is something to suit everyone's taste.



There are no formal auditions, but a reasonable level of musical proficiency is required – equivalent to Grade 5 standard – although it is not a pre-requisite to have taken the exam.
